Pom Pom Sheep

YOU WILL NEED:








WARNING: wire rings may have sharp edges

🕇 Wire ring, black card, wiggly eyes, bell, pipe cleaner & scrap cardboard Check out step-by-step photos below.





- 2. Wrap the wool around the top 2 sections of your cardboard U about 50 times.
- 3. Cut a piece of wool about 30cm long. Slide one end in the middle of the cardboard U prongs at the bottom, and the other at the top. Tie in a double knot, flip and repeat. Leave the ends long so you can tie your sheep onto your wreath.
- 4. Gently slide the wool off the card then carefully cut through the middle of your loops. BE CAREFUL not to cut through the knot you tied in step 3.
- **5.** Fluff your pom pom out and trim the ends to tidy if needed.
- 6. Use the template sheet to cut out your sheep's head from the black card. Use glue to stick on the wiggly eyes and then use tape to stick the face onto the pom pom.
- 7. To make the legs, fold your black pipe cleaner in half and cut. Poke this through the tied threads in the middle of the pom pom under the face, then bend over.

WREATH:

- 8. Wrap another colour of wool around the wire wreath as a background. If you've got spare wool or string in other colours at home, add these in too. Use the template sheet and scrap coloured paper to add little flowers or stars.
- 9. Use wool to tie the sheep to the bottom of your wreath.
- 10. Thread wool through the back of the bell, then tie onto the wreath under the sheep so it will jingle in the breeze.
- 11. Add a loop of wool or twine to the top of the wreath and hang it up to display.
